## Loudoun Amateur Radio Group Regular Meeting Minutes June 17, 2023

## Venue: Leesburg Lutheran Church

Meeting called to order at 8:35 AM.

- Pledge of Allegiance
- Three visitors were recognized. W3OW Bruce, KO4JCM Melissa and KM4UBX Mike.
- Gary N7BRW presented material that describes his life as a radio Subject Matter Expert (SME). Gary has lived in many foreign countries as a member of US radio listening operations. He showed pictures of an array of vertical antennas arranged in a circle. The array is used for direction finding of the source of an RF signal. The station in the Philippines had three concentric rings of antennas. The inner ring was made up of rotatable antennas. The next ring was verticals. The outer ring was rhombics. Antennas were connected to high power transmitters using hardline coax that is pressurized with nitrogen to prevent arcing of the high power signals.

The transmitters were rated as 10 kw power. The power was generated in several stages, each with a successively higher power driver. Some antennas were constructed using helical polarization. This polarization compensates for possible cross polarization. Helical polarization is useful for satellite communications when the satellite may be tumbling to present a constantly changing polarization. The helically polarized antenna has a reduction in gain compared to linear antenna elements.
